Scope of Work: Painting for Residential Low-Rise Project

1. General Overview

This scope covers all labor and materials required for the interior and exterior painting of the residential low-rise project. All work shall follow project specifications, drawings, and applicable codes.

2. Interior Painting

- **Surface Preparation**: Prepare all interior surfaces to be painted, including walls, ceilings, doors, trims, baseboards, and bulkheads.
- Primer and Finish Coats:
 - o Apply one coat of primer.
 - o Apply two coats of finish with washable flat material for all interior surfaces.
- Wall Finishes: Use Lift Master Flat for walls as specified.
- Ceiling:
 - o Finish all ceilings with white flat paint.
 - o Ensure smooth ceiling surfaces.
- Trims and Doors:
 - o Apply white semi-gloss paint to trims and doors.
 - o Ensure a smooth and durable finish.
- Stairs and Railings:
 - Stain oak stairs with a natural varnish finish.
 - o Stain railings and finish with natural varnish as per the drawings.
- Touch-up Work: Include one final touch-up before project completion.

3. Exterior Painting

- Primer and Finish Coats:
 - o Apply one coat of primer to exterior surfaces.
 - o Apply one coat of finish paint to all external elements as required.
- Doors and Frames:
 - o Paint the front door, side doors, and garage frame.
 - o Ensure smooth, even coverage.
- **Lintels**: Paint the lintels where indicated in the design.

4. Extra Painting Items (As Needed or Upon Request)

The following extra work items may be required if not detailed in the drawings:

- Staining:
 - Stain railings, pickets, stairs, and stringers.
 - o Stain railings and paint pickets white where specified.
 - Stain French doors as needed.
- Color Changes:

- o Paint rooms with different colors upon request.
- o Apply paint to cornice moulding (plain or dentil).

• Additional Elements:

- o Paint extra interior doors and frames as required.
- o Prime and paint the garage drywall.
- o Finish and stain nosing, maple staircases, and any extra windows casing.
- Complete touch-ups and additional work for items such as fireplaces, upgraded trim, or open basements.

• Clean-Up and Quality Control

- o Clean exterior masonry work to the satisfaction of the Owner and architect.
- Ensure all material delivered is stored properly to prevent damage by water or breakage.
- Remove all construction debris to the designated trash collection area, leaving the job site clean.
- o Correct any items found during the final inspection before payment is made.

• Compliance

- Ensure all work complies with the Ontario Building Code (OBC) and relevant safety and environmental regulations.
- o Adhere to all applicable local and provincial codes and standards.
- o Follow best practices to ensure long-term reliability and performance.
- Conduct regular quality checks and ensure all work meets the highest standards of craftsmanship.
